Committee Reports:

<u>Pool</u>: Sharon McClosky reported that Atlantic Pools inspected the pool and corrected all leaks for a cost of \$980.50.

<u>Lakes:</u> Roger Mayrand reported that he attempted to correspond with Wendy at Aquatic Systems via email, but had received no replies as of this date.

Landscaping: No report

<u>Architectural:</u> Lynn Amsterdam reported that one home with a green driveway remains to be corrected, and that six homes would receive their second notices.

Alliance and Rec Center: Steve Ragno reported that the penny additional sales tax will result in an increase in Recreation association dues of \$4.00 monthly/\$12 quarterly.

<u>Beautification:</u> Lynn Amsterdam reported that she is in contact with several contractors in regard to replacement of the two entrance signs, and that more news is forthcoming.

<u>Old Business:</u> Rodger addressed the topic of French drains for lakeside homeowners. It was decided that homeowners will decide on the option needed for their situation.

New Business: Ellen broached the topic of changing our association documents to include a 20% minimum down payment for new buyers. Ellen will present more information at the next meeting.
